
Key Tour Information

- 3-Hour eco cruise aboard open style vessels.
- Highlights: Explore towering cliffs and deep sea caves. Join in the search for the abundant coastal wildlife such as seals, dolphins, migrating whales and sea birds.
- Departure Point: 1005 Adventure Bay Road, Adventure Bay, Bruny Island.
- Option to join a guided bus transfer from Hobart or Kettering.
- Lots of warm clothing is essential, even on warmer days due to wind chill.

Car Parking and Visitor Centre Access

- The Bruny Island Cruises Visitor Centre is located at 1005 Adventure Bay Road, Adventure Bay. 5 accessible parking spaces are available immediately to the left when you drive in. This is within 50 metres of the entrance foyer.
- There is a gentle sloping ramp for access. The car park is gravel and the ramp is smooth concrete.
- The door into the entrance foyer is a 1050mm wide manual door. Call our Bruny Island office when you arrive on 03 6293 1465 if you need assistance with the door or access to the building.





- From the entrance foyer, there is either a 19-step spiral staircase or an elevator. The elevator is around the corner to the right from when you enter the foyer.
- Elevator Dimensions: 890mm Wide x 1500mm Depth.
- Once at the top of the stairs or elevator, this is the main level with toilets, gift shop, reception desk and restaurant.
- The flooring is a combination of polished concrete and polished floorboards.
- There is also vehicle access available for pick-up and drop-off at the jetty for vessel departure. One member of each group will need to check-in at the visitor centre to collect waterproof clothing and receive a pre-cruise briefing.
- It is always a good idea to use the bathrooms available in the visitor centre before cruise departure.
- See the restaurant staff if you wish to pre-order lunch before departure this will reduce wait time after the cruise.

Vessel Boarding and Seating

- It's important to be checked in and ready to go 15 minutes prior to your cruise departure time. This is when the pre-cruise briefing will be delivered on the balcony before all guests move to the vessel/s.
- We can arrange for individual pre-boarding. Speak to staff about this when you check-in.



- Cruise departure is from a jetty located 350 metres from the visitor centre along a wide, gently sloping gravel path.
- Vehicle access is also available to the jetty, where the vessel will be within 50 metres of your vehicle.





- The jetty itself has a sloping design to allow for near-level access regardless of tide height.
- There is a small step across to a 340mm wide non-slip pad with a 780mm wide access gate.
- There is a 160mm step down onto a 350mm wide step, then a 210mm step down onto a 540mm wide aisle. There are good hand holds on the vessel and crew members present to manually assist.



- The vessels each have a total of 43 seats consisting of:
 - 32 seats forward of the skippers' console that require seatbelts to be worn whenever the vessel is travelling at speed. Seatbelt extensions are available.
 - 11 seats behind the skippers' console that do not have seatbelts fitted including a 6-person padded bench seat that is 2760mm across.
- The seats are 450mm wide and have 330mm of legroom. There is 850mm between the back of each seat.
- From front to back, the vessel seating rows are as follows:
 - \circ 1 row of 2 seats
 - $\circ~$ 2 rows of 3 seats
 - \circ 6 rows of 4 seats
 - $\circ~$ 1 row of 5 seats
 - \circ 1 six person padded bench seat

Toilet Facilities

• There is a toilet on the vessel, but we recommend for all guests to use the toilets at the visitor centre prior to departure.



- There are ample toilet facilities in the visitor centre, along with one large wheelchair accessible toilet.
- The small marine toilet on the vessel is located below deck level and has 4 steps down at 250mm each. Door entry width is 450mm.
- Access to this toilet can also be restricted at the skippers' discretion due to weather conditions.





Full-Day Tour Options

- In addition to the 3-hour cruise, guests are also able to join the tour from our Hobart Office or Kettering meeting point. Information is included below about access to these departure points.
- Information is included below about access to these two departure points.
- Toilet facilities are available throughout the day at the Kettering ferry terminal and at Truganini Lookout before reaching the Bruny Island Cruises visitor centre.
- A stop is made at Truganini Lookout (The Neck). 20 minutes is given to enjoy a track either to the top of the lookout (230 steps) or a wheelchair accessible boardwalk to a vantage point over the beach.

Hobart Office

- Centrally located on the Hobart waterfront this is an easy meeting point to begin your journey to Bruny Island.
- Address: Dock Head Building, Franklin Wharf, Hobart.
- Arrive at 7:30 am for a 7:45 am departure.
- There is time restricted parking available opposite the office including an accessible car park for pick-up and drop-off.
- The closest all-day parking is available at either:
 - \circ Argyle Street Carpark 500 metres away, undercover car-parking
 - $\circ~$ Market Place Carpark 400 metres away, undercover car-parking
 - $\circ~$ Evans Street Carpark 550 metres away, open-air parking
- Taxi or Uber is also available to our Hobart office.
- There is ramped entry to the booking office where you will meet for the tour. Transport is provided on one of our buses, further information follows.

Kettering Meeting Point

- This is a convenient way to join our Bruny Island Cruise if you are travelling with your own car and would like to enjoy a guided tour and avoid the added pressure of the ferry crossing.
- 32km south of Hobart (allow 40 minutes to drive here)
- Arrive for an 8:30am departure.
- Meet at the Oyster Cove Marina at our signposted Kettering meeting point.
- All-day free parking is available here.
- The bus will stop behind where you park your car.
- The driver will meet you here at 8:30am. Transport is provided on one of our buses. Further information on bus access follows.

Buses

- We offer full-day tour options on board our fleet of buses departing from both Hobart and Kettering to join the Bruny Island Cruise.
- The type of bus used varies daily based on operational considerations.
- The buses are air-conditioned and have seatbelts fitted.
- The buses are not wheelchair accessible and do have steps to board but do have storage available for standard sized collapsible wheelchairs and walkers.

37-Seat and 43-Seat Bonluck Coaches

- The access door is 670mm wide.
- First step is 230mm high, followed by 5 steps at 170mm high.
- Aisle width is 350mm. Legroom is 300mm with a seat width of 460mm.
- There is a large luggage area for walkers and wheelchairs.







41-Seat Bonluck Coach

- The access door is 700mm wide.
- First step is 270mm high, followed by 5 steps at 200mm high.
- Aisle width is 370mm. Legroom is 315mm with a seat width of 450mm.
- There is a large luggage area for walkers and wheelchairs.





20-Seat Toyota Coaster

- The access door is 650mm wide.
- First step is 170mm high, second step 90mm high, third step 300mm high.
- Aisle width is 400mm. Legroom is 210mm with a seat width of 460mm.
